From the Fire Chief

On behalf of the chief officers and members of The Richland Township Volunteer Fire Department (RTFD), I am pleased to present the 2023 Annual Report.

Throughout this past year, members and staff have worked hard to continue the level of service that our coverage area has come to expect. The RTFD handled 946 total incidents in 2023, a decrease of 56 incidents from the previous year.

The RTFD remains devoted to providing our communities with excellent emergency service protection. At the end of July 2023, we added our 4th career firefighter position to our daylight staffing to supplement the volunteers. We now have driver and officer coverage from 7am until 6pm, seven (7) days a week. With the addition of these positions, the residents, businesses and visitors to our coverage area benefit from quicker response times during their time of need.

The RTFD continues to strive to be the best that we can. Several of our members became fire service instructors in 2023, which greatly improves our training department. Several other members are on that same path for 2024.

The working relationship with our municipal governments that we serve is very important to our success and I thank them all for working hand in hand with us.

We look forward to continuing our progress as we move through 2024!


The RTFD responded to a total of 946 incidents in 2023. Of those incidents, an average of 10 firefighters responded to each incident. 600 of the 946 incidents occurred when career staffing was on duty. The average turnout time was 01:43 and the total response time was 05:26 while career staffed. The average turnout time was 02:33 and the total response time was 06:31 while crewed by volunteers alone. There were 156 overlapping calls throughout the year. The following is the analysis of the incidents for 2023.








DEPARTMENT TRAINING

The RTFD, in conjunction with the East Hill Training Association, prides itself in the highest quality of training in the area. Weekly Tuesday training nights allow us to remain sharp on our skills and techniques. The RTFD had a total of 53 members that were involved in ongoing training classes throughout the 2023. The total amount of training hours that was logged in 2023 was over 3300 hours. The dedication of our members weekly is outstanding!

Several members have takes classes to begin their way to becoming certified instructors. This process will benefit all members as well as the general public.

An on-site training area at the rear of our Scalp Avenue station enables us to simulate specific scenarios and create a more realistic training environment. In 2023, we purchased a Multi-Force Forcible Entry Door System from "Firehouse Innovations" to better train our members. This prop keeps our members sharp and it can be used at any time.










GOALS FOR 2024

The RTFD has many plans for 2024! The addition of the 4th career firefighter enables us to now cover all weekends with a driver and officer. This permits us to meet our goal of lowering our ISO rating when the next cycle comes due, which benefits everyone with insurance ratings.

We have several members that have become fire service instructors. This helps us train our own members in our station without having to send them out of district. This adds another level of certified firefighters to our core group of members.

Moving forward with our training site, one of the goals is to proceed with the construction of our rope tower. This will give us many new training opportunities in our own backyard.

We are also in the final stages of placing our Technical Rescue Trailer in service. This unit will enhance our capabilities for trench rescue and other technical rescue services in the area.

With the continued support of our community, The Richland Township Supervisors and the Geistown Borough Council, we will continue our goal of providing the best possible service that we can.

In closing, we would like to thank all of our mutual aid departments that assist us throughout the year.
